## ILLINI INITIATIVE / PENN FAMILY

In this month's newsletter I really just want to ask you to please pray for us during Easter. This day is so important as it gives us an opportunity to bring many international students to church, and for many of these students it will be the first time that they step foot into a church.

Here is a look at how Easter works for us. First we ask students from the English Corner if they would like to experience an Easter holiday with an American family. We share with them that they will go to church with us, eat a traditional Easter meal with us, and play traditional Easter Games with our kids. In the past few years we have had 8-12 students sign up to go to Easter with us. This day is filled with the Gospel. Last year on the ten minute walk to the church service with the students I was asked by a Chinese student, "How does someone become a Christian?" I was so grateful to have the opportunity to share about Jesus on the day we celebrate His resurrection.

I would also ask that you pray for my conversation group called "Big Questions of Life". We have several students from many different backgrounds and beliefs. It is a time I get to share every week of how Jesus and the Bible helps me answer these big questions of life. There is a Chinese student started to follow up with questions about faith through email. I ask that you would pray for her. There is visiting scholar from Turkey, who would like to see what an American church is like. I ask for prayers for him.

I don't know what will take place in the hearts of these students in the future. I do know that in order for there to be fruit in the future the seed must be planted in the present. Thank you, all of you who support and pray for us. It is you who make it possible for us to plant the seed of the gospel among these international students.


At our March SOS meeting, we held a pre-baby shower for Sister Emilee and Brother Curtis.

## STATE ASSOCIATION REPORT

Delegates, pastors, visitors and representatives of our National Offices enjoyed the 2016 State Association which met at the Calvary Church in Salem, Illinois as they heard these reports.

Stirring and challenging sermons from three young men from Illinois as they spoke on the subject: "Ministering with Purpose". Brother Jamie Lee, Brother Curtis Smith and Brother Josh Colson delivered the Word with power.

State Treasurer, Tim Hayes, report that we sent \$124,989.58 to National Ministries. Our Together Way Plan totaled \$98,629.57 for the year. Also, the association had received a dividend check from Brotherhood Mutual for \$13,601.00.

Hazel Dell Church, Oak Grove Church, Alexander Church and Calvary Church are searching for a pastor.

Brother Alton Loveless is compiling a list of ladies who served as preachers in Illinois in the 1800 and early 1900's. The Executive Board recommended the following allocations for our Together Way Fund for 2016:

\*The Disaster Response Fund has sufficient funds for the coming year. When the need arises, this board will be included in the allocations.

Welch College students have received over \$33,000 frrom the Christian Education Board over the past ten years. That program continues this year with 11 students receiving scholarship monies. This board is also offering to pay the complete registration fees to Illinois pastors attending the RHMA Small Town Pastor's Conference in Morton, Illinois April 18-20. The CTS Board has set April 29-30 as the date for CTS State Competition at the Ina Church.

The Illinois Board of Missions had a long, interesting and informational report with reports from missionaries, film clips and updates on the mission teams supported through Illinois Regional Support.

The Camp Board reported that Camp Hope had 389 campers last summer, had made several improvements to the camp and has two major improvement projects scheduled for the near future. A bath and shower room addition for the Girl's Dorm will provide 6 additional toilets and showers as well as 8-10 sinks and mirrors. Estimated cost: \$54,000. Also, The Caretaker's Home needs repairs and updates at a cost of \$35,000. Dates for the 2016 Youth Camps:

Brother Curtis Smith was elected to serve as Moderator for the next year with Brother Tyler Penn serving as Assistant Moderator.
