Hello Dear Friends!

We arrived back in France on March 8! There was a small welcoming party at the airport comprised of family, friends, and co-workers. As you can see it was a typical rainy, dreary day in Nantes. We didn't mind the weather; we were just so excited to make it back. That evening we were awake and feeling so good we went to church at La

Haie Fouassière. We were wound up!!During our first week back we were able to visit withour children and their families. It was so wonderful to be back together after nine months apart. Grandchildren always change quickly, but especiallywhen one doesn't see them often. We were giving ourselves a week before jumping into ministry, but unfortunately the virus had already made its appearance. Our plans for the next week came to a sudden halt. The weekend of March 15th it was already suggested that we limit meetings and we were



even encouraged to stay at home. Tuesday the 17th it was lockdown! Sadly it was back to phones and the internet. So during the next two months we worked on correspondence through the internet because at that time the postal system here was not reliable. Otherwise like everyone else we did phone calls, video chats, zoom and skype meetings. Dennis continued to record sermons every week as he had done monthly in the US. We are definitely not techy people but with help we managed. We are so thankful to have a house with a yard so we could enjoy being outside some and doing some repair work, pulling weeds, and planting our small garden.

We realize that you lived through the same kind of confinement and managed like we did, so you totally understand our situation. May 11 things started opening up for us but with rules and regulations to follow. At the St. Nazaire church we are obligated to have two services in order to keep the distancing rules which limit us to 40 at a time. Gradually more of our people are attending plus some visitors have recently been coming. With the arrival of summer and the Christian vacationers who attend, we will probably need to keep having two services. Who knows the church may grow so much that even without the distancing two services will be needed!! The La Haie Fouassière church that we are a part of has been meeting in Joel's back yard when weather permits because our room is too little for the distancing. The best attended meeting included eleven adults and eight children. We were thankful that so many came.

After May 11th, we celebrated two family birthdays, mother's day and father's day, and we took a picture with the social distancing! We are so proud of and thankful for our three sons. During this time there have been sad events in many places, but we are thankful that God has been at work answering prayers, speaking to hearts and giving peace and comfort. Thank you so much for making it possible for us to be back and for being part of what we are trying to accomplish in France. May God bless you as you fit into his plan in your place of ministry.


