BRIEF REPORT ON 2021 NATIONAL CONVENTION

MEMPHIS 2021

During the 2021 convention, delegates made some important decisions. The denomination voted to accept two resolutions spelling out important doctrinal stances. Both resolutions are lengthy, but here is a brief statement to summarize each of them:


1. A resolution to define the Free Will Baptist doctrinal stance regarding gender, marriage, and sexuality, including the commitment to: “teach and model a biblical understanding of sexuality and gender in their families and churches, seeking to equip church members and leaders to help them remain faithful to this teaching...”
2. A resolution reaffirming the denomination’s stance on racism and resolving the denomination “root its proclamation, witness, and efforts toward racial equality in language, thought forms, and understandings of justice that emerge from Holy Scripture rather than in language, thought forms, and understandings of justice that emerge from secular philosophical and sociological theory, such as critical race theory intersectionality.”

In addition, delegates approved a slate of recommendations from the General Board, including:

- + Adopt a 2022 Denominational Budget of \$30,100,000.
- + Limit denominational officers to two, four year consecutive terms and commission members to two consecutive five-year terms.
- + Integrate the Manual for Board Members into each National Board’s operating procedures.
- + Update the nominating procedures in the Treatise.
- + Update the Treatise statement regarding marriage.

Note: The National Association registered 2,764 for the Convention and 2,237 for the Vertical Three activities, for a unique total of 3,318.

Delegates honored missionary Carlisle Hanna for 70 years of faithfulness



CARLISLE HANNA

Brother Carlisle Hanna served for 70 years in India...the longest missions career for any missionary in any missions organization. Appointed in 1951, he and his wife landed in the country in 1952. Because of his ministry, today there are: 120 church planters and evangelists, 300 FWB churches in northeast India, 13 churches in southwestern India, and 35 churches in Nepal. There are now 17,000 believers with about 5,000 to 6,000 attending their National Conference each year. His wife and daughter died during their time there.

The Bridge Church has continued to have good services throughout this year. We usually have about 40 out of the 50 or so people involved with our church on a Sunday morning. On Saturday July 3rd we held a Summer Bash event that brought in over 100 visitors to our location that day to enjoy the food and activities. We were so glad to see so many of our church people come and serve that day. They did it all from cook to collect information to set up games and paint children's faces. We are trying to be faithful to the work the Lord has called us to do. Please be in prayer with us that God would send a church planter to come and lead the church into its next phase of service for His Kingdom.

I know that as the July wraps up more and more focus returns to schools. I would ask that you would pray for our ministry as we enter into another fall semester at the University of Illinois. We will still have to manage some of the restrictions for Covid and not exactly for sure how everything will go. I pray that this year would be another good year of meeting with international students from all around the world and sharing the love of Jesus with them.

Thank you so much for continue prayers and support of our ministry here. During the last 2 years our account with I.M. has taken a pretty good hit.
