We have had for over a year, Christian men from Ukraine coming to the St. Nazaire church because they are working in the shipyards. They speak very little French or English, so our conversations are extremely limited. Google translate does help some! Being separated from their families is difficult but you can imagine with the war and their not being able to help get their families out. Thankfully several of the families have left the country. Two wives and their children have arrived to join their husbands in St. Nazaire. Our church people found a house "for free" for one family until the end of June and gifts from the church and the owner have it furnished. (The homeowner is a friend of a church member and wants to visit the church now!) The other family has been provided with an apartment for a short time. Two other families are safe in Germany and cared for so they will remain there for a while.

We mentioned about all the people coming to our churches in the newsletter. The good news! But at St. Nazaire, our families are really being attacked by problems. We would ask you to pray for reconciliation and salvation in several families – some are both Christians, some have one believer and one not, married for years or some relatively newlyweds, and others thinking of marriage. We had a couples' seminar at St. Nazaire with Jerry and Barb Gibbs the 25th, 26th and 27th of April. One couple made a very important decision at the end. Praise the Lord for them and their future.

Also at Mosaïque (La Haie Fouassière) there are disappointments in some who have made professions of faith and have dropped out. Another is struggling in his commitment to the Lord. Then there are others who are still making progress but moving forward is very slow. We need God's wisdom in dealing with these situations and prayers for all of them.

All our family is doing well. We're thankful for them and their part in the Mosaïque church. We are always feeling blessed to be near them.
