Looking back...2023 seemed to pass by so quickly. And in the grand scheme of things, our church was richly blessed by all the events that occurred since our last posting.

Let's begin with Hometown Christmas at the end of November, when both J-City Church and our Center for Hope and Renewal passed out goodies for hundreds of children and spoke to their parents. The seventh edition of Arrow News, our town's only local newspaper, and a service of the Center, distributed throughout Johnston City for free...with more people grabbing a copy than ever. Shortly thereafter, a podcast from the Arrow, featuring the editor Keith Fletcher, was broadcast— and it's about time for the January issue to hit the streets.

Our church was blessed one Sunday morning by the Glory Gals, our ladies SS class, that sang a lively tune called "Joy". Two weeks later, the GG's did an encore since the 3rd week of Advent is "Joy". And our church is growing! Attendance crested over 50...first time since Covid...and we praise the Lord for the increase. Another young man, an 8th grader named Jaden, accepted Jesus as his Savior...plus Scott, a gentleman who prayed the sinner's prayer and was baptized on the 17th... and we are praying for more.

Our town's ministerial alliance meets at the Center monthly, and we did our part to fill our share of 80 boxes of food for needy families. There was a candlelight communion service on Christmas Eve night, with attendees from other churches joining us. A Christmas break VBS, titled "All Things New" was just completed, telling elementary kids about how they can be made new with Jesus. Marta Phillips is the director of VBS. Finally, we are making plans to participate in a 5th Sunday Sing in January...check your calendars (?).

We are growing closer like a family as we gather for prayer, praise and preaching. Our prayers are for your churches to be blessed the same.

We received the following letter this past month. As I read the message I was reminded of Paul's vision while he was in Troas conducting his 2nd missionary journey. As recorded in Acts 16:9, "There stood a man of Macedonia, and prayed him, saying, Come over into Macedonia, and help us."

I am the pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church in Salem, Oregon and I am also the Promotional Director for the Northwest Association of FWB (Oregon, Washington, Montana). Bro. Roy Thomas called me one day just over 35 years ago to ask me about churches

needing a pastor out west. He told me during that conversation that he was having a hard time getting men to move west of the Mississippi River and north of the Mason-Dixon Line. He asked me if he could give my name to several churches needing a pastor out west. Since I had just completed a term as interim pastor for the First FWB Church in Florence, SC, I said yes and the rest is history.

The Northwest Association has a history filled with churches closing because of the inability to secure a pastor after praying and waiting an extended period of time for God's man to come and shepherd the church. I have been at my church now 35 years and my time here is drawing to a close. I am writing to seek your help in finding an associate pastor for us here in Salem with the intent to transition into the role of senior pastor after a time of adjusting. My wife and I intend to move back east to be closer to our children. I don't want to see this church close after a long history of involvement in the city and of sharing the Gospel in a spiritually dark area of the country (the Salem church was a Home Missions work of the late 1970's).

I have listed our church's need on the NAFWB website and have included in the qualifications the ability to go long periods of time between fellowship with other FWB pastors and attendance at

denominational events, conferences, and gatherings (Distance makes fellowship with other FWB difficult). I have also included the ability to withstand our rainy season from November through April and the reduced sunshine that goes along with it.

We also have a church in Eugene, OR looking for a pastor. This church is on the verge of closing after the founding pastor Mike Criswell retired after 35 years as well. It has been nearly two years since he retired. Eugene is the home of Oregon University and an hour south of Salem and two hours south of Portland on the I-5 corridor.

Would you keep us in mind as your go about your duties and I pray God will bring to mind our need at the appropriate time as you speak with others. Thank you. Here is my contact information.
