



Honors for 46 Years of Service to Illinois Free Will Baptists As Promotional Secretary Bro Shores shares some perspective of his time in office

My sincere thanks, love and appreciation to the Illinois State Association for the beautiful plaque and the gift card presented to me during the Thursday evening service at Victory Church on March 14th. I have always loved our Illinois churches and their willingness to love and give to denominational causes.

I also want to thank my wife, Pat and our family for never hindering me from doing this work. They had to spend many family gatherings without me because I was called somewhere to serve the churches.

Brother Ivan Ryan asked me to give a word to you all in this issue of our Newsletter since I have retired from the position of Promotional Secretary, a job I truly loved. Although I am a very private person and try to shun the spotlight, I will mention a few things as I reminisce.

Following Brother George Waggoner and Brother Gene Norris, I began as Promotional Secretary in 1978. At that time, we had a typewriter, a mimeograph machine and an addressing machine that used stamped aluminum plates for addresses. Most people do not even remember such equipment. It was a very slow process getting the Illinois Newsletter printed and mailed. Today we have computers, printers and addressing units that speed up the process.

Pat and I started visiting churches from the northern end of Illinois to the southern part of the state, from Rockford to Thebes. I would get off work on Friday evening and we drove to the various churches and came back usually late Sunday night or very early Monday morning. It was a blessed opportunity to visit the churches and get acquainted with people and their style of worship. It was also a special privilege to get to know the pastors and understand their heart; share their burdens and learn of their love for the people they served. I also discovered there were some men (not many) who were not in the spiritual condition to serve in ministry.

Although I had no executive powers, I was involved with helping settle church business conflicts, tried to help churches secure pastors, listen to complaints about leadership, and tried to look at conflicts as objectively as possible. In every case I told the parties involved I would also speak to people on both sides of the issue. ... next page...

I think I have attended every state meeting since its inception in 1960 and I tried to stay quiet in our business sessions and I never felt I had to voice my opinion on the debate floor if someone else had already said what I thought was correct, unless I was asked to do so. Illinois has a unique organization by having boards which handle their own affairs. Our system functions well without conflict or competition.

There is great unity among our boards and concern for one another. I am happy to be a part of such a state meeting that in all things has tried to please the Lord with loving cooperation. Thank you, everyone for trying to serve the Lord in the unity of the Spirit!
