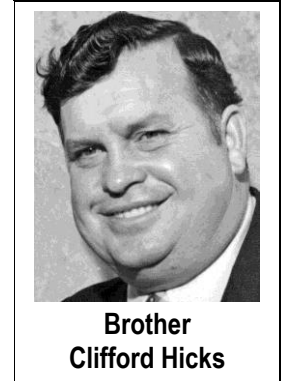
BROTHER CLIFFORD HICKS WITH THE LORD
